WHEREAS, a classical music expert and collector, Phil Watlington has also served as the "voice" of the Danville Symphony Orchestra for the past decade, narrating and announcing at concerts; and

WHEREAS, Phil Watlington has demonstrated an extraordinary commitment to excellence in broadcasting and dedication to the community throughout his 50-year career; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend Philip Watlington on the occasion of his golden anniversary in broadcasting; and, be it
