WHEREAS, Ben Lacy earned numerous awards and accolades over the course of his career, including recognition in the 2010 and 2011 *Best Lawyers in America* and inclusion as one of Virginia's "Legal Elite" by *Virginia Business* magazine; and

WHEREAS, Ben Lacy devoted countless hours serving others through his pro bono work and received the Volunteer of the Year award from the Greater Richmond Bar Foundation for his work with the Pro Bono Clearinghouse; and

WHEREAS, Ben Lacy also generously gave of his time and talents as a board member of the Central Virginia Chapter of the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, elder at River Road Presbyterian Church, and board member of the Commonwealth Club; and

WHEREAS, a true Virginia gentleman who touched the lives of countless individuals with his kind words, thoughtful manner, and good humor, Ben Lacy will be greatly missed by his beloved wife, Sandy; children, Rice and Callie, and their families; and numerous other family members, friends, and colleagues; now, therefore, be it
