## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 718**

Offered January 11, 2013

3 Commemorating the life and legacy of Michael Wise.

6 WHEREAS, Michael Wise, the pioneer, emigrated from the environs of Basel, Switzerland, and came
7 to America in 1751 to pursue a life of liberty and happiness for himself and his family; and

8 WHEREAS, Michael Wise, the pioneer, with wife Barbara, and children John, Anna Barbara,
9 Michael, Adam, Elizabeth, and Catherine, first came to Virginia in the 1770s to the Swiss-German
10 settlement of Massanutten near present-day Luray, and then in the 1780s relocated to the newly created
11 Rockingham County near present-day Bridgewater; and

WHEREAS, Michael Wise, the patriot, responded to George Washington's call for a Continental
Army, and in 1775 became one of the first to enlist in the newly formed army, specifically, Captain
Michael Rader's Company, Dunmore County, Virginia Militia; and

WHEREAS, Michael Wise, the presbyter, donated the land for the church and cemetery bearing his
 name, St. Michael's, near present-day Bridgewater, Virginia, formerly a German Reformed Church and
 currently United Church of Christ; and

18 WHEREAS, Michael Wise, the patriarch, today has thousands of documented descendants; and

WHEREAS, the descendants of Michael Wise honored him on Sunday, October 28, 2012, with a memorial granite bench on the grounds of St. Michael's Church; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
 commemorate the life and legacy of a Revolutionary War patriot, Michael Wise; and, be it

23 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution

for presentation to Nathan H. Miller, a descendant of Michael Wise and former member of the VirginiaHouse of Delegates and Senate, as an expression of the General Assembly's appreciation for Michael
