9	the health of women for 10 years and more than 627,000 women's lives have been saved and 330 fewer
10	women are dying every day; and
11	WHEREAS, heart disease is the No. 1 killer of women, yet only one in five American women
12	believes that heart disease is her greatest health threat; and
13	WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases cause one in three women's deaths each year, killing
14	approximately one woman every minute; and
15	WHEREAS, an estimated 43 million women in the United States are affected by cardiovascular
16	diseases; and
17 18	WHEREAS, ninety percent of women have one or more risk factors for developing heart disease;
1ð 19	and WHEREAS women comprise only 24 percent of participants in all heart related studies; and
20	WHEREAS, women comprise only 24 percent of participants in all heart-related studies; and WHEREAS, since 1984, more women than men have died each year from heart disease and the gap

25	Women is asking all women across America to join in making America Go Red and save women's
