WHEREAS, over the years, Bill Holtzman expanded his business holdings, forming Holtzman Propane in 1997; served as president of Little Apple Properties, Inc.; became owner of one-third of Liberty Petroleum in 2000; and formed Valley Ice in 2005; and

WHEREAS, Bill Holtzman was recognized for his entrepreneurial endeavors with selection as the Ernst and Young Entrepreneur of the Year in 2001 and the Shenandoah University Harry F. Byrd, Jr. School of Business Entrepreneur of the Year for 2005; and

WHEREAS, a respected business leader, Bill Holtzman takes pride in providing superior service and products to his customers, operating on a foundation of honesty, integrity, and fair dealing, and has made many contributions to his industry as a member and former president of the Rockingham, Page, and Shenandoah Counties' Oilmen's Association; and

WHEREAS, committed to the economic growth and development of Shenandoah County and the Commonwealth, Bill Holtzman has provided strong leadership to the Virginia Agribusiness Council, Virginia State Horticultural Society, Shenandoah County Fruit Growers Association, Shenandoah County Economic Development Committee, First Virginia Bank, Mount Jackson Chamber of Commerce, and Mount Jackson Town Council; and
