WHEREAS, on March 4, 2013, the nation will celebrate the 200th anniversary of James Madison's second inauguration as President of the United States; and

8 WHEREAS, James Madison, more than any other single individual, successfully engineered the 9 framing and ratifying of the Constitution that has ensured the freedom, peace, and prosperity this nation 10 has enjoyed for more than two centuries; furthermore, in the first Congress, he served as chief architect 11 and principal advocate for America's Bill of Rights, the 10 amendments that have protected those 12 liberties retained by the people; and

WHEREAS, James Madison, as President, safeguarded that Constitution by resisting usurpation of
 power, a remarkable achievement considering that, as Commander in Chief, he navigated the ship of
 state through the treacherous waters of this nation's first war; and

WHEREAS, the inimitable Dolley Madison, by epitomizing Virginian hospitality and charm in theWhite House, has henceforth become a beloved exemplar of what a First Lady should be; and

WHEREAS, The Montpelier Foundation, with the encouragement and support of Orange County, the
 district that launched Mr. Madison's political career, has fulfilled and continues to fulfill its mission to
 preserve and promote the enduring legacy of President James Madison and his gracious wife, Dolley;
 and

WHEREAS, the Robert H. Smith Center for the Constitution at James Madison's Montpelier has, in
its short 10 years of existence, become a leading hub for disseminating (in Mr. Madison's own words)
"the history of a Constitution on which would be staked the happiness of a people great even in its
infancy, and possibly the cause of Liberty throughout the world"; now, therefore, be it
