HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 190

Celebrating the life of Ida Mabel Bright.

Agreed to by the House of Delegates, February 21, 2013

WHEREAS, Mabel Bright was predeceased by her husband, James; grandchild, Vernon; and great-grandchild, Chermere; and will be greatly missed by her children, Vernon, Audrey, and Shirley; grandchildren, Cynthia, Keith, Cordell, and Wendy; and great-grandchildren, John and Marcel; now, therefore, be it
