4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-5136 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the rates and charges of
5 6	a water or waste authority.

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10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 15.2-5136 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 15.2-5136. Rates and charges.
13	A. The authority may fix and revise rates, fees and other charges (which shall include, but not be
14	limited to, a penalty not to exceed ten 10 percent on delinquent accounts, and interest on the principal),
15	subject to the provisions of this section, for the use of and for the services furnished or to be furnished
16	by any system, or streetlight system in King George County, or refuse collection and disposal system or
17	facilities incident thereto, owned, operated or maintained by the authority, or facilities incident thereto,
18 19	for which the authority has issued revenue bonds as authorized by this chapter. Such rates, fees and charges shall be so fixed and revised as to provide funds, with other funds available for such purposes,
19 20	sufficient at all times (i) to pay the cost of maintaining, repairing and operating the system or systems,
2 0 2 1	or facilities incident thereto, for which such bonds were issued, including reserves for such purposes and
22	for replacement and depreciation and necessary extensions, (ii) to pay the principal of and the interest on
23	the revenue bonds as they become due and reserves therefor, and (iii) to provide a margin of safety for
24	making such payments. The authority shall charge and collect the rates, fees and charges so fixed or
25 26	revised. P The rates for water (including fire protection) and sewer service (including dispessel) shall be
20 27	B. The rates for water (including fire protection) and sewer service (including disposal) shall be sufficient to cover the expenses necessary or properly attributable to furnishing the class of services for
28	which the charges are made. However, the authority may fix rates and charges for the services and
29	facilities of its water system sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining its
30	sewer system (including disposal) and all or any part of the principal of or the interest on the revenue
31	bonds issued for such sewer or sewage disposal system, and may pledge any surplus revenues of its
32 33	water system, subject to prior pledges thereof, for such purposes. C. Rates, fees and charges for the services of a sewer or sewage disposal system shall be just and
33 34	equitable, and may be based upon:
35	1. The quantity of water used or the number and size of sewer connections;
36	2. The number and kind of plumbing fixtures in use in the premises connected with the sewer or
37	sewage disposal system;
38	3. The number or average number of persons residing or working in or otherwise connected with
39 40	such premises or the type or character of such premises; 4. Any other factor affecting the use of the facilities furnished; or
40 41	5. Any combination of the foregoing factors.
42	However, the authority may fix rates and charges for services of its sewer or sewage disposal system
43	sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining its water system, including
44	distribution and disposal, and all or any part of the principal of or the interest on the revenue bonds
45	issued for such water system, and to pledge any surplus revenues of its water system, subject to prior
46 47	pledges thereof, for such purposes. D. Water and sewer rates, fees and charges established by any authority shall be fair and reasonable.
48	An authority may charge fair and reasonable rates, fees, and charges to create reserves for expansion of
49	its water and sewer or sewage disposal systems. Such rates, fees, and charges shall be reviewed by the
50	authority periodically and shall be adjusted, if necessary, to assure that they continue to be fair and
51	reasonable. However, any authority may charge and collect rates, fees, and charges to create a reserve
52	fund for reasonable expansion of its water, sewer, or sewage disposal system. Nothing herein shall affect
53 54	existing contracts with bondholders which are in conflict with any of the foregoing provisions.
54 55	E. Rates, fees and charges for the service of a streetlight system shall be just and equitable, and may be based upon:
55 56	1. The portion of such system used;
57	2. The number and size of premises benefiting therefrom;
58	3. The number or average number of persons residing or working in or otherwise connected with

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59 such premises;

- 60 4. The type or character of such premises;
- 61 5. Any other factor affecting the use of the facilities furnished; or
- 62 6. Any combination of the foregoing factors.

63 However, the authority may fix rates and charges for the service of its streetlight system sufficient to 64 pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining such system.

65 F. The authority may also fix rates and charges for the services and facilities of a water system or a refuse collection and disposal system sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and 66 maintaining facilities incident thereto for the generation or transmission of power and all or any part of 67 the principal of or interest upon the revenue bonds issued for any such facilities incident thereto, and to **68** 69 pledge any surplus revenues from any such system, subject to prior pledges thereof, for such purposes. 70 Charges for services to premises, including services to manufacturing and industrial plants, obtaining all 71 or a part of their water supply from sources other than a public water system may be determined by 72 gauging or metering or in any other manner approved by the authority.

73 G. No sewer, sewage disposal or storm water control rates, fees or charges shall be fixed under 74 subsections A through F of this section or under subdivision 10 of § 15.2-5114 until after a public 75 hearing at which all of the users of such the systems or facilities; the owners, tenants or occupants of 76 property served or to be served thereby; and all others interested have had an opportunity to be heard 77 concerning the proposed rates, fees and charges. After the adoption by the authority of a resolution 78 setting forth the preliminary schedule or schedules fixing and classifying such rates, fees and charges, 79 notice of a public hearing, setting forth the proposed schedule or schedules of rates, fees and charges, 80 shall be given by two publications, at least six days apart, in a newspaper having a general circulation in the area to be served by such systems or facilities, with the second notice being published at least sixty 81 14 days before the date fixed in such notice for the hearing. The hearing may be adjourned from time to 82 83 time. A copy of the notice shall be mailed to the governing bodies of all localities in which such 84 systems or facilities or any part thereof is located. After the hearing the preliminary schedule or 85 schedules, either as originally adopted or as amended, shall be adopted and put into effect.

H. No refuse collection and disposal rates, fees or charges shall be fixed under subsections A through 86 87 F until after a public hearing at which all of the users of such facilities; the owners, tenants or 88 occupants of property served or to be served thereby; and all others interested have had an opportunity 89 to be heard concerning the proposed rates, fees and charges. After the adoption by the authority of a 90 resolution setting forth the preliminary schedule or schedules fixing and classifying such rates, fees and 91 charges, notice of a public hearing, setting forth the proposed schedule or schedules of rates, fees and 92 charges, shall be given by a single publication in a newspaper having a general circulation in the area to 93 be served by such systems at least fifteen days before the date fixed in such notice for the hearing. The 94 hearing may be adjourned from time to time. A copy of the notice shall be mailed to the governing 95 bodies of all localities in which such systems or any part thereof is located. After the hearing the preliminary schedule or schedules, either as originally adopted or as amended, may be adopted and put 96 97 into effect.

98 I. A copy of the schedule or schedules of the final rates, fees and charges fixed in accordance with 99 subsection G or H shall be kept on file in the office of the clerk or secretary of the governing body of 100 each locality in which such systems or any part thereof is located, and shall be open to inspection by all 101 interested parties. The rates, fees or charges so fixed for any class of users or property served shall be 102 extended to cover any additional properties thereafter served which fall within the same class, without 103 the necessity of a hearing or notice. Any increase in any rates, fees or charges under this section shall 104 be made in the manner provided in subsection G. Any other change or revision of the rates, fees or charges may be made in the same manner as the rates, fees or charges were originally established as 105 106 provided in subsection G or H.

107 I. No rates, fees or charges established, fixed, changed or revised before January 1, 2013, by any
108 authority pursuant to this section or to subdivision 10 of § 15.2-5114 shall be invalidated because of
109 any defect in or failure to publish or provide any notice required under this section or any predecessor
110 provision.
