10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 46.2-711 and 46.2-715 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-711. Furnishing number and design of plates; displaying on vehicles required.
13	A. The Department shall furnish one license plate for every registered motorcycle, tractor truck motor
14	vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer, and two license plates for every other registered motor vehicle, except to
15	licensed motor vehicle dealers and persons delivering unladen vehicles who shall be furnished one
16	license plate. The license plates for trailers, semitrailers, commercial vehicles, and trucks, other than
17	license plates for dealers, may be of such design as to prevent removal without mutilating some part of
18	the indicia forming a part of the license plate, when secured to the bracket.
19	B. The Department shall issue appropriately designated license plates for:
20	1. Passenger-carrying vehicles for rent or hire for the transportation of passengers for private trips;
21 22	 Taxicabs; Passenger-carrying vehicles operated by common carriers or restricted common carriers;
23	4. Property-carrying motor vehicles to applicants who operate as private carriers only;
23 74	5. Applicants who operate motor vehicles as carriers for rent or hire;
24 25	6. Vehicles operated by nonemergency medical transportation carriers as defined in § 46.2-2000; and
26	7. Trailers and semitrailers.
27	C. (Effective until July 1, 2012) The Department shall issue appropriately designated license plates
28	for motor vehicles held for rental as defined in § 58.1-2401.
29	C. (Effective July 1, 2012) The Department shall issue appropriately designated license plates for
30	motor vehicles held for rental as defined in § 58.1-1735.
31	D. No vehicles shall be operated on the highways in the Commonwealth without displaying the
32	license plates required by this chapter. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to vehicles used
33	to collect and deliver the Unites States mail to the extent that their rear license plates may be covered
34	by the "CAUTION, FREQUENT STOPS, U.S. MAIL" sign when the vehicle is engaged in the
35	collection and delivery of the United States mail.
36	E. Pickup or panel trucks are exempt from the provisions of subsection B with reference to
37	displaying for-hire license plates when operated as a carrier for rent or hire. However, this exemption
38	shall not apply to pickup or panel trucks subject to regulation under Chapter 21 (§ 46.2-2100 et seq.) of
39 40	this title.
40 41	§ 46.2-715. Display of license plates.
41 42	License plates assigned to a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, tractor truck, trailer, or semitrailer, or to persons licensed as motor vehicle dealers or transporters of unladen vehicles, shall be
+2 43	semitrailer, or to persons licensed as motor vehicle dealers or transporters of unladen vehicles, shall be attached to the front and the rear of the vehicle. The license plate assigned to a motorcycle, trailer, or
+3 44	semitrailer shall be attached to the rear of the vehicle. The license plate assigned to a tractor truck shall
45	be attached to the front of the vehicle. The license plates issued to licensed motor vehicle dealers and to
46	persons licensed as transporters of unladen vehicles shall consist of one plate for each set issued and
47	shall be attached to the rear of the vehicle to which it is assigned.
