	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 63.2-607.1 as follows:
12	§ 63.2-607.1. Eligibility for TANF; drug-related felonies.
13	A person who is otherwise eligible to receive TANF assistance shall be exempt from the application $f = \frac{1}{2} \int \frac$
14	of § 115(a)(1) of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L.
15	104-193, and shall not be denied such assistance solely because he has been convicted of a felony
16	offense of possession of a controlled substance in violation of § 18.2-250, provided such person complies
17	with, or has already complied with, all obligations imposed by the criminal court and the Department;
18	is actively engaged in or has completed a substance abuse treatment program; and participates in
19	periodic drug screenings. [A person who fails or refuses to participate in periodic drug testing or tests
20	positive for the use of illegal substances shall be ineligible to receive TANF benefits for a period of 12
21	months; however, an individual shall have one opportunity to comply with the testing requirement and
22	be reinstated to eligibility for TANF benefits during the 12-month period following the date of his
23	failure or refusal to participate in a drug test or testing positive for the use of illegal substances.]
24	[2. That the provisions of this act shall not become effective unless an appropriation of general

25 funds effectuating the purposes of this act is included in a general appropriation act passed by the 26 2013 Session of the General Assembly, which becomes law. ] ENGROSSED
