That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-2963.2 as follows: 10 § 54.1-2963.2. Lyme disease testing information disclosure. A. Every licensee or his in-office designee who orders a laboratory test for the presence of Lyme 11 disease shall provide to the patient or his legal representative the following written information: 12 "ACCORDING TO THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION, AS OF 2011 13 14 LYME DISEASE IS THE SIXTH FASTEST GROWING DISEASE IN THE UNITED STATES. YOUR HEALTH CARE PROVIDER HAS ORDERED A LABORATORY TEST FOR THE PRESENCE 15 16 OF LYME DISEASE FOR YOU. CURRENT LABORATORY TESTING FOR LYME DISEASE CAN BE PROBLEMATIC AND STANDARD LABORATORY TESTS OFTEN RESULT IN FALSE NEGATIVE AND 17 FALSE POSITIVE RESULTS, AND IF DONE TOO EARLY, YOU MAY NOT HAVE PRODUCED 18 ENOUGH ANTIBODIES TO BE CONSIDERED POSITIVE BECAUSE YOUR IMMUNE RESPONSE 19 20 REQUIRES TIME TO DEVELOP ANTIBODIES. IF YOU ARE TESTED FOR LYME DISEASE, AND THE RESULTS ARE NEGATIVE, THIS DOES NOT NECESSARILY MEAN YOU DO NOT HAVE LYME 21 DISEASE. IF YOU CONTINUE TO EXPERIENCE SYMPTOMS, YOU SHOULD CONTACT YOUR 22 23 HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AND INQUIRE ABOUT THE APPROPRIATENESS OF RETESTING OR ADDITIONAL TREATMENT. 24 25 B. Licensees shall be immune from civil liability for the provision of the written information required

- **26** by this section absent gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- 27 2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2018.

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
