4	Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) to study the effects on third
5	grade Standards of Learning (SOL) achievement levels of increasing classroom instruction time in
6 7	reading and mathematics in lieu of participating in SOL assessments in science and in history and social science.

12	WHEREAS, most third grade students at public elementary schools in the Commonwealth participate
13	in SOL assessments in reading, in mathematics, in science and in history and social science; and
14	WHEREAS, preparing for and taking assessments in science and in history and social studies takes
15	time away from other areas, including the important subjects of reading and mathematics, and may
16 17	adversely affect the educational experience and academic achievement of some students; and WHEREAS, a pilot program to study the achievement levels of third grade students who do not
18	participate in the SOL assessments in science and in history and social studies and who instead receive
19	additional classroom instructional time in reading and mathematics would provide the Board of
20	Education with data useful for the Board's regular review and revision of the Standards of Learning
21	pursuant to § 22.1-253.13:1; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That JLARC be directed to study the
23 24	effects on third grade SOL achievement levels of increasing classroom instruction time in reading and mathematics in lieu of participating in SOL assessments in science and in history and social science.
25	In conducting its study, JLARC shall select 16 local school divisions—two local school divisions in
26	each of the eight Superintendent's Regions identified by the Board of Education—to participate in a pilot
27	program in which certain elementary schools in each selected local school division shall not administer
28	the SOL assessments in science and in history and social science to third grade students, notwithstanding
29 30	§ 22.1-253.13:3 or any other provision of law to the contrary. Such elementary schools shall continue to
30 31	administer benchmark assessments in science and in history and social science. JLARC staff shall ensure that selected local school divisions represent a fair cross section of students in all student subgroups
32	identified pursuant to the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, P.L. 89-10, as
33	amended, including the African American, Hispanic, English language learners, and economically
34	disadvantaged student subgroups. In addition, JLARC staff shall ensure that selected local school
35	divisions represent a fair cross section of urban, suburban, and rural areas.
36 37	The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall notify the local school divisions that have been
37 38	selected to participate in the pilot program. The school boards in these local school divisions shall select at least two elementary schools in the local school division to participate in the pilot program. The
39	school boards shall also identify a peer elementary school in the local school division with similar
40	student demographics to be paired, for control group purposes, with each elementary school selected to
41	participate in the pilot program.
42	Elementary schools that have been selected to participate in the pilot program shall use the additional
43 44	instruction time for study in reading and mathematics. Elementary schools that have been selected to participate in the pilot program shall notify the parents of all third grade students that their child will
45	not participate in SOL assessments in science and in history and social science and will instead receive
46	additional instruction in reading and mathematics.
47	The pilot program shall be effective for two years, beginning with the 2013-2014 school year and
48	concluding at the end of the 2014-2015 school year. At the conclusion of the pilot program, the Board
49 50	of Education shall provide JLARC staff with (i) a list of the elementary schools selected to participate in the pilot program (ii) a list of the page elementary schools identified by the school beards (iii) a list of
50 51	the pilot program, (ii) a list of the peer elementary schools identified by the school boards, (iii) a list of the third grade teachers at each selected elementary school who participated in the pilot program, (iv) a
52	de-identified list of the results of third grade students who participated in the pilot program on SOL
53	assessments in reading and mathematics, and (v) a de-identified list of the results, for each year of the
54	pilot program, of third grade students at the peer elementary schools identified by the school boards on
55	SOL assessments in reading and mathematics. The Board shall ensure that the student-level data
56	collected is identified in such a way that student performance can be tracked across multiple years while
57	the identities of such students remain private.

JLARC staff shall administer a survey to the third grade students who participated in the pilot 58

59 program to obtain information on the students' attitudes on foregoing the SOL assessments in science. JLARC staff shall administer a survey to the third grade teachers who participated in the pilot program to obtain information on (a) how each teacher used the additional instructional time, (b) how much time each teacher spent teaching science and how much time each teacher spent teaching history and social science, (c) each teacher's opinion about the advisability of continuing and expanding the pilot program, and (d) how, if at all, forgoing the administration of the SOL assessments in science and in history and social science improved the educational experience and academic achievement of their students.

JLARC shall compare the assessment results of the pilot program participants with the control group
students, analyze the results of the teacher surveys, and determine the effect of increasing classroom
instruction time in reading and mathematics in lieu of participating in SOL assessments in science and
in history and social science.

Technical assistance shall be provided to JLARC by the Board of Education. All agencies of the
 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to JLARC for this study, upon request.

JLARC shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2014 and shall complete the 72 study by November 30, 2015, and the Chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated 73 Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 74 75 Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. The executive summaries shall state whether JLARC intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and 76 77 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports 78 shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's 79 80 website.
