residents of Reston has also been evident in his role as a former member of the Fairfax County Athletic
 Council, chair of the Fairfax County Park Authority board, board member of the Reston YMCA, and
 numerous roles, including chair, within the Reston Community Center; and

WHEREAS, Bill Bouie also served as a member of Project Gold 2000 for the U.S. Olympic
 Committee, which works to improve minority and female participation in Olympics-related sports organizations; and

WHEREAS, Bill Bouie served as the first president of Friends of Reston for Community Projects,
Inc., and as the principal volunteer in the endeavor to raise funds for the Reston Nature House, which
opened in 2009 to provide environmental education to the community; and
WHEREAS, passionate about the importance and power of the arts, Bill Bouie serves on the
