14	WHEREAS, although the General Assembly has considered several measures increasing judicial	
15	retirement age, no consensus has been reached on an age or on the practicalities of doing so; now,	U
16	therefore, be it	
17	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the State Crime Commission be	
18	directed to study mandatory retirement of judges. In conducting its study, the Commission shall	
19	determine the financial impact of increasing the mandatory age of retirement for judges and the effect	
20	such an increase will have on the service provided by such judges.	
21	Technical assistance shall be provided to the State Crime Commission by the Virginia Retirement	
22	System. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission for this study,	\mathbf{v}
23 24	upon request. The State Crime Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2012, and the Chairman	S169
24 25	shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and	9
23 26	recommendations no later than the first day of the 2013 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The	
20 27	executive summary shall state whether the Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and
