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- **2. Patron:** Marshall, D. W.
- **3. Committee:** General Laws
- **4. Title:** Contractors, Board for; creation of residential and commercial contractor license categories.
- **5. Summary:** This bill authorizes the Board for Contractors to establish separate license categories for residential and commercial contractors for each of the current licensing categories: Class A, B, and C contractor licenses.
- 6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.
- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See #8.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), there are estimated to be 650 to 1,000 commercial contractors, who as a result of this legislation, would not pay into the Contractor Transaction Recovery Fund. This amounts to 325 to 500 each year, or \$16,250 to \$25,000 less going into the fund each year. Current statute requires a minimum fund balance of \$400,000. DPOR does not believe this reduction will impact the solvency of the fund or ability to pay out claims.
- **9.** Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.

- **11. Other Comments:** According to DPOR, the cash balance of the Contractor Transaction Recovery Fund at the end of FY 2012 totaled \$1.5 million.

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
