- 3. Committee: Passed both houses.
- 4. Title: Driving while texting; primary offense; increased penalties.
- 5. Summary: Provides that driving while texting is a traffic infraction punishable, for a first offense, by a fine of \$250 and, for a second or subsequent offense, by a fine of \$500. The current penalties are \$20 for a first offense and \$50 for a second or subsequent offense. The bill also changes the offense from a secondary offense (one that can only be charged when the offender is stopped for another, separate offense) to a primary offense.

- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final.
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** Although this legislation could have a possible additional revenue impact from additional convictions and a higher fine, it is impossible to determine the extent of the impact at this time.
