**2. Patron:** Newman

**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Sex offender registry; prior convictions.

**5. Summary:** Requires that once a person's name is placed on the sex offender registry for a qualifying conviction or finding of not guilty by reason of insanity, the registry must list all prior known sex offense convictions that would require registration if the conviction occurred today. Under current law, convictions that occurred on or after July 1, 1994, and convictions for which the offender was incarcerated or on probation on or after July 1, 1994, are included on the registry. The bill will not add additional persons to the registry but will require pre-1994 conviction history for those who are already on the registry.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate; See Item 8 below.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of State Police, the fiscal impact of the proposal cannot be determined. The agency reports that it is unable to determine employees' overtime costs that would be incurred in identifying past sex-related convictions of the existing sex offender registrants.
