1.	Title:	Exchange of inmate medical records					

5. Summary:

Currently, the Department of Corrections is authorized to exchange medical and mental information and records of persons committed to the custody of the department among officials and staff within the department, members of the Parole Board, medical and mental health hospitals, and community service boards. Such exchanges can be made only for specified reasons and are subject to confidentiality regulations of the Board of Corrections. Furthermore, any medical or mental health information concerning a prisoner that has been exchanged may be used only as provided by statute and shall otherwise remain confidential and protected from disclosure.

The proposed language adds the Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services, the Department of Social Services, and local departments of social services to the list of entities among which inmate medical and mental health information may be exchanged. Such exchanges would be limited to the purposes of reentry planning and post-incarceration placement and services.
