11. Other Comments: The substitute bill adds subsections e. and f. to the new section 4. Subsection e. requires the hiring school division to pay the employer share of retirement contributions to VRS as if the person were a covered employee. Subsection f. requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to make a finding that there is a demonstrated need to fill the positions and that there are no qualified applicants other than a person receiving a VRS service retirement allowance; the VRS Board of Trustees must also accept these findings. The substitute bill is consistent with VRS' comments in the previous FIS that note that return to work bills in the past have generally been confined to employee groups where critical shortages exist, and that similar bills in the past have required the school divisions that hire these individuals to pay the employer contribution to the VRS. The changes in the substitute bill do not add a fiscal impact and would result in a slight savings due to the employer contributions.
