**3. Committee:** Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources

**4. Title:** Hunting; lawful to hunt or kill nuisance species on Sunday.

**5. Summary:** This bill makes it lawful to hunt or kill nuisance species on Sunday. Among the species that could be hunted on Sunday are blackbirds, coyotes, crows, cowbirds, feral swine, grackles, English sparrows, starlings, and those species designated as nuisance species by regulations of the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate. See #8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, any fiscal impact resulting from this legislation is not quantifiable at this time. The agency expects an increase in dispatch call intake during the first year of implementation. In addition, the department may need to authorize overtime for conservation officers, or hire additional officers, to enforce provisions of this bill. Any impact, however, is expected to be minimal.
