4. Title: Board of Housing and Community Development; Statewide Fire Prevention Code.

5. Summary: Board of Housing and Community Development; Statewide Fire Prevention Code; annual operational permits for certain open burning. Provides for the Board of Housing and Community Development to promulgate regulations to allow food vendors servicing community events to obtain an annual operational permit for open burning when the permit is limited to community events and the open flame that the vendor uses at such events is limited to flammable hydrocarbon jelly packaged in a small can for use as a portable heat source for cooking.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Housing and Community Development may incur some costs in developing the regulations. However, any such costs are anticipated to be minimal and could be absorbed within existing resources.
