**3. Committee:** Rehabilitation and Social Services

**4. Title:** Background checks; children's residential facilities regulated by the Department of Juvenile Justice.

**5. Summary:** The substitute adds local secure detention facilities to those “children’s residential facilities” required to comply with the background check and barrier crimes provisions. It prohibits individuals, starting with the facility on or after July 1, 2013, with certain criminal backgrounds from working, volunteering, or providing services at Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) operated children’s residential facilities or any children’s residential facility it regulates. The substitute allows secure detention facilities to process the background checks through a state or local agency (e.g., DJJ or the local sheriff’s department).

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Juvenile Justice and the Department of State Police, the substitute is not expected to have a fiscal impact on either agency.
