10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 22.1-201 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 22.1-201. Study of documents of Virginia history and United States Constitution.
13	To increase knowledge of citizens' rights and responsibilities thereunder and to enhance the
14	understanding of Virginia's unique role in the history of the United States, the Declaration of American
15	Independence, the general principles of the Constitution of the United States, including the Bill of
16	Rights, the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom, the charters of the Virginia Company of April 10,
17	1606, May 23, 1609, and March 12, 1612, of The Virginia Company, and the Virginia Declaration of
18	Rights shall be thoroughly explained and taught by teachers to pupils in public elementary, middle, and
19	high schools. Emphasis shall be given to the relationship between these documents and Virginia history,
20	and to citizenship responsibilities inherent in the rights included in these documents. Each teacher shall
21	ensure that all supplementary written materials that he uses to teach these documents contain accurate
22	restatements of the principles contained in such documents. Written examinations as to each of such
23	documents shall be given.
24	2. That the Department of Education shall develop guidelines for supplementary written materials
25	that teachers use to teach the Declaration of American Independence, the general principles of the

Constitution of the United States, including the Bill of Rights, the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom, the charters of the Virginia Company of April 10, 1606, May 23, 1609, and March 12, 26 27 28

1612, and the Virginia Declaration of Rights.
