13	The General Assembly shall establish a compensation and expense plan in the general appropriation
14	act for the secretaries and members of the electoral boards that provides for the Commonwealth to
15	reimburse the counties and cities for the full cost of the compensation and expenses of the secretaries
16	and members of the electoral boards. The governing body for the county or city of each electoral board
17 18	shall pay all of the compensation, and expenses, and including mileage in accordance with the plan, of the secretary and members of the electoral board and shall be reimbursed annually as authorized by the
19	act for the full amount of such compensation and expenses, notwithstanding any provision of the general
20	appropriation act to the contrary. The reasonable costs of electoral board members attending annual
21	training programs provided by the State Board shall be included in the expense plan for electoral boards.
22	Each electoral board member shall submit a written claim for mileage and expenses authorized by
23 24	the plan. The claim, when filed and found to be correct, shall be paid by the county or city. The county
24 25	or city shall pay claims for mileage at the rate payable to members of the General Assembly. The governing body of any county or city may pay to the secretary of the electoral board any

28	Each county and city shall furnish necessary postage and office supplies for the electoral board.

30 31	The General Assembly shall establish a compensation <i>and expense</i> plan in the general appropriation
31 32	act for the general registrars that provides for the Commonwealth to reimburse the counties and cities for the full cost of the compensation and expenses of the general registrars. The governing body for the
33	county or city of each general registrar shall pay all of the compensation in accordance with the plan
34	and reasonable expenses of the general registrar and shall be reimbursed annually as authorized in the
35	act for the full amount of such compensation and expenses, notwithstanding any provision of the general
36	appropriation act to the contrary. The governing body shall be required to provide benefits to the
37 38	general and assistant registrars and staff as provided to other employees of the locality, and shall be authorized to supplement the selery of the general registrar to the extent provided in the set
30 39	authorized to supplement the salary of the general registrar to the extent provided in the act. Each locality shall pay the reasonable expenses of the general registrar, including reimbursement for

Reasonable expenses include, but are not limited to, 42 costs for: (i) an adequately trained registrar's staff, including training in the use of computers and other 43 technology to the extent provided to other local employees with similar job responsibilities, and 44 reasonable costs for the general registrar or at least one member of the registrar's staff to attend the 45 annual training offered by the State Board; (ii) adequate training for officers of election; (iii) conducting 46 elections as required by this title; and (iv) voter education.
