Any party may make, at his own expense, a simultaneous stenographic or audio record of the deposition. Upon 14 15 request and at his own expense, any party is entitled to an audio or audio-visual copy of the 16 audio-visual recording. The audio-visual recording is an official record of the deposition. A transcript prepared by a court 17 18

reporter shall also be deemed an official record of the deposition. An audio-visual deposition may be used for any purpose and under any circumstances in which a stenographic deposition may be used.

An attorney authorized to practice before a court in the Commonwealth shall not post or release to the Internet, any portion of a video deposition without the written permission of the individual being deposed.

For purposes of this article, "audio-visual" shall include video conferencing and teleconferencing.
