§ 30-110. Disclosure.

209 A. Every legislator and legislator-elect shall file, as a condition to assuming office, a disclosure 210 statement of his personal interests and such other information as is specified on the form set forth in 211 § 30-111 and thereafter shall file such a statement annually on or before January 8 semiannually by 212 January 1 for the preceding six-month period complete through November 30 and by July 1 for the preceding six-month period complete through May 31. When the filing deadline falls on a Saturday, 213 Sunday, or legal holiday, the disclosure statement shall be filed on the next day that is not a Saturday, 214 Sunday, or legal holiday. Disclosure forms shall be provided by the clerk of the appropriate house to 215 each legislator and legislator-elect not later than November 30 of each year than December 1 for the 216 217 January 1 filing and not later than June 1 for the July 1 filing. Members of the Senate shall file their disclosure forms with the Clerk of the Senate and members of the House of Delegates shall file their 218 disclosure forms with the Clerk of the House of Delegates. The disclosure forms of the members of the 219 220 General Assembly shall be maintained as public records for five years in the office of the clerk of the 221 appropriate house.

B. Candidates for the General Assembly shall file a disclosure statement of their personal interests as 222 223 required by §§ 24.2-500 through 24.2-503.

C. Any legislator who has a personal interest in any transaction pending before the General 224 Assembly and who is disqualified from participating in that transaction pursuant to § 30-108 and the 225 226 rules of his house shall disclose his interest in accordance with the applicable rule of his house.

227 § 30-111. Disclosure form.

228 A. The disclosure form to be used for filings required by subsections A and B of § 30-110 shall be 229 substantially as follows: 230 STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS. 231 Name 232 Office or position held or sought 233 Home address 234 Names of members of immediate family 235 DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATORY MATERIAL. 236 "Business" means a corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship, firm, enterprise, franchise, 237 association, trust or foundation, or any other individual or entity carrying on a business or profession, 238 whether or not for profit. 239 "Close financial association" means an association in which the filer shares significant financial involvement with an individual and the filer would reasonably be expected to be aware of the 240 241 individual's business activities and would have access to the necessary records either directly or through 242 the individual. "Close financial association" does not mean an association based on (i) the receipt of 243 retirement benefits or deferred compensation from a business by which the legislator is no longer employed, or (ii) the receipt of compensation for work performed by the legislator as an independent 244 245 contractor of a business that represents an entity before any state governmental agency when the 246 legislator has had no communications with the state governmental agency. 247 "Contingent liability" means a liability that is not presently fixed or determined, but may become 248 fixed or determined in the future with the occurrence of some certain event. 249 "Dependent" means any person, whether or not related by blood or marriage, who receives from the 250 legislator, or provides to the legislator, more than one-half of his financial support. 251 "Gift" means any gratuity, favor, discount, entertainment, hospitality, loan, forbearance, or other item 252 having monetary value. It includes services as well as gifts of transportation, local travel, lodgings and meals, whether provided in-kind, by purchase of a ticket, payment in advance or reimbursement after the expense has been incurred. "Gift" shall not include any offer of a ticket or other admission or pass 253 254 unless the ticket, admission, or pass is used. "Gift" shall not include honorary degrees and presents from 255 256 relatives. "Relative" means the donee's spouse, child, uncle, aunt, niece, or nephew; a person to whom the donee is engaged to be married; the donee's or his spouse's parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, 257 258 or sister; or the donee's brother's or sister's spouse. 259 "Immediate family" means (i) a spouse and (ii) any other person residing in the same household as the legislator, who is a dependent of the legislator or of whom the legislator is a dependent. 260 261 "Lobbyist relationship" means (i) an engagement, agreement, or representation that relates to legal services, consulting services, or public relations services, whether gratuitous or for compensation, 262 263 between a member or member-elect and any person who is, or has been within the prior calendar year, 264 registered as a lobbyist with the Secretary of the Commonwealth, or (ii) a greater than three percent ownership interest by a member or member-elect in a business that employs, or engages as an 265 independent contractor, any person who is, or has been within the prior calendar year, registered as a 266 267 lobbyist with the Secretary of the Commonwealth. The disclosure of a lobbyist relationship shall not (i) 268 constitute a waiver of any attorney-client or other privilege, (ii) require a waiver of any attorney-client 269 or other privilege for a third party, or (iii) be required where a member or member-elect is employed or 270 engaged by a person and such person also employs or engages a person in a lobbyist relationship so 271 long as the member or member-elect has no financial interest in the lobbyist relationship. 272 TRUST. If you or your immediate family, separately or together, are the only beneficiaries of a trust, 273 treat the trust's assets as if you own them directly. If you or your immediate family has a proportional 274 interest in a trust, treat that proportion of the trust's assets as if you own them directly. 743 B. Any legislator who makes a knowing misstatement of a material fact on the Statement of
 744 Economic Interests shall be subject to disciplinary action for such violations by the house in which the
 745 legislator sits.

C. In accordance with the rules of each house, the Statement of Economic Interests of all members of each house shall be reviewed. If a legislator's Statement is found to be inadequate as filed, the legislator shall be notified in writing and directed to file an amended Statement correcting the indicated deficiencies, and a time shall be set within which such amendment shall be filed. If the Statement of Economic Interests, in either its original or amended form, is found to be adequate as filed, the legislator's filing shall be deemed in full compliance with this section as to the information disclosed thereon.

753 D. Ten percent of the membership of a house, on the basis of newly discovered facts, may in writing 754 request the house in which those members sit, in accordance with the rules of that house, to review the 755 Statement of Economic Interests of another member of that house in order to determine the adequacy of 756 his filing. In accordance with the rules of each house, each Statement of Economic Interests shall be 757 promptly reviewed, the adequacy of the filing determined, and notice given in writing to the legislator whose Statement is in issue. Should it be determined that the Statement requires correction,augmentation or revision, the legislator involved shall be directed to make the changes required withinsuch time as shall be set under the rules of each house.

761 If a legislator, after having been notified in writing in accordance with the rules of the house in which he sits that his Statement is inadequate as filed, fails to amend his Statement so as to come into compliance within the time limit set, he shall be subject to disciplinary action by the house in which he sits. No legislator shall vote on any question relating to his own Statement.
