1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER 2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 59.1-435 and 59.1-438 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 59.1-440.1, relating to the Extended Service Contract Act; 4 scope of services provided. 5 6 Approved 7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 1. That §§ 59.1-435 and 59.1-438 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the 9 Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 59.1-440.1 as follows: 10 § 59.1-435. Definitions. 11 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning: 12 "Board" means the Virginia Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 13 14 or his designee. 15 "Consumer product" means tangible personal property primarily used for personal, family, or household purposes. 16 "Extended service contract" or "contract" means a written contract or agreement for a specific 17 duration in return for the payment of a segregated charge by the purchaser to perform the repair or 18 19 replacement of any consumer product, including a motor vehicle, or indemnification for repair or replacement, for the operational or structural failure of any consumer product, including a motor vehicle, 20 21 due to a defect in materials, workmanship, inherent defect, or normal wear and tear, with or without additional provisions for incidental payment of indemnity under limited circumstances, including, but not 22 23 limited to, towing, rental, and emergency road service and road hazard protection. Extended service 24 contracts may provide for the any one or more of the following: 25 1. The repair or replacement of any consumer product for damage resulting from power surges or 26 interruption or accidental damage from handling. Extended service contracts are not insurance in the 27 Commonwealth or otherwise regulated under Title 38.2.; 28 2. The repair or replacement of tires or wheels, or both, on a motor vehicle damaged as the result of 29 coming into contact with a road hazard; 30 3. The removal of dents, dings, or creases on a motor vehicle that can be repaired using the process 31 of paintless dent removal without affecting the existing paint finish and without replacing vehicle body 32 panels, sanding, bonding, or painting; 33 4. The repair of chips or cracks in, or the replacement of, a motor vehicle windshield as a result of 34 damage caused by a road hazard; 35 5. The replacement of a motor vehicle key or key fob in the event that the key or key fob becomes 36 inoperable or is lost or stolen; 37 6. The installation on or application to a motor vehicle of a protective chemical, substance, device, 38 or system that (i) is designed to prevent loss or damage to the motor vehicle from a specific cause and 39 (ii) includes, within or as an accompaniment to the extended service contract, an agreement that 40 provides for payment to or on behalf of the purchaser of incidental costs in the event that the protective 41 chemical, substance, device, or system fails to prevent loss or damage as specified, provided that the 42 reimbursement of incidental costs under such agreement is tied to the purchase of a protective chemical, 43 substance, device, or system that is formulated or designed to make the specified loss or damage less 44 likely to occur; or 45 7. Any other service that may be designated by the Board as provided in subsection B of § 59.1-438. "Extended service contract" does not include a contract or agreement that provides (i) for the 46 application of fuel additives, oil additives, or other chemical products to the engine, transmission, or 47 48 fuel system of a motor vehicle or (ii) coverage for (a) the repair of damage to the interior surfaces of a 49 motor vehicle or the replacement of the interior surfaces of a motor vehicle, or both, or (b) the repair 50 of damage to the exterior paint finish of a motor vehicle or the replacement of the exterior paint finish of a motor vehicle, or both, unless the coverage is provided under a product warranty included in 51 connection with the sale of a protective chemical, substance, device, or system described in subdivision 52 53 6. 54 "Extended service contract provider" or "provider" means any person or entity other than a public 55 service corporation supervised by the State Corporation Commission, who is the original manufacturer or

seller and who solicits, offers, advertises, or executes extended service contracts. Such definition

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includes the obligor of the contract sold, solicited, offered, advertised or executed by the original 57 58 manufacturer, seller or obligor.

"Obligor" means the person who is contractually obligated to the purchaser to provide services under 59 the extended service contract and who is (i) the original manufacturer or seller of the merchandise 60 61 covered by the extended service contract, (ii) acting through or with the written consent of the original manufacturer, seller or purchaser of the merchandise covered by the extended service contract, or (iii) 62 acting through or with the written consent of a manufacturer or seller of merchandise similar to the 63 64 merchandise covered by the extended service contract.

"Purchaser" means a person who enters into an extended service contract with an extended service 65 66 contract provider.

67 "Road hazard" means a hazard that is encountered while driving a motor vehicle, including potholes, 68 rocks, wood debris, metal parts, glass, plastic, curbs, and composite scraps. 69

§ 59.1-438. Regulations.

70 A. The Board is authorized to prescribe adopt reasonable regulations in order to implement provisions in this chapter relating to extended service contracts. These regulations shall be adopted, 71 72 amended, or repealed in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.).

73 B. Without limiting the authority of the Board under subsection A, the Board is authorized to adopt 74 reasonable regulations that designate services, in addition to those enumerated in the definition of 75 extended service contract in § 59.1-435, that may be provided under an extended service contract, 76 provided that the designation of the additional services is not inconsistent with the provisions of this 77 chapter.

78 § 59.1-440.1. Extended service contracts not insurance.

Extended service contracts are (i) not contracts of insurance in the Commonwealth and (ii) not 79 80 subject to regulation under Title 38.2.
