14105425D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 40** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules 4 on February 28, 2014) 5 6 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Albo) Requesting the Office of the State Investigator General to study Medicaid-funded transportation services 7 in the Commonwealth. Report. 8 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has incorporated nonemergency transportation services into the state 9 Medicaid program, services that are often used to transport individuals with physical, intellectual, and 10 other disabilities to and from medical, mental health, and other appointments; and 11 WHEREAS, the Department of Medical Assistance Services' current contract for such nonemergency transportation services expires in October 2014, with the option for three one-year contract extensions; 12 13 and 14 WHEREAS, over 600 complaints about the current nonemergency transportation services were filed 15 with the Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board staff in 2012, and similar complaints were reported across the state in 2013, including failure to arrive by the provider; late or unreasonably early 16 17 arrivals; transportation of individuals to incorrect addresses; drivers unable, unwilling, or unaware of their responsibility to assist riders; and extraordinarily lengthy wait times before individuals are 18 19 transported back to their residences; and 20 WHEREAS, this problem is of particular concern given that many of these clients are medically 21 fragile, have conditions that require regular ongoing medical or mental health care, or rely on the 22 nonemergency transportation service to reach care providers; and WHEREAS, in response to complaints lodged with the Department of Medical Assistance Services 23 24 about the current nonemergency transportation services, a performance improvement plan was adopted in 25 September 2012 to increase monitoring of nonemergency medical transportation services, including 26 responsiveness to complaints, deadlines for addressing multiple problems, and accountability measures; 27 and 28 WHEREAS, despite these attempts to improve service delivery, complaints from Medicaid recipients 29 who use the nonemergency transportation service continue to demonstrate serious shortcomings in the 30 service delivery; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Office of the State 31 32 Investigator General be requested to study Medicaid-funded nonemergency transportation services in the 33 Commonwealth. 34 In conducting its study, the Office of the State Investigator General shall (i) review the performance 35 of the current nonemergency transportation provider during the course of the current contract from the perspective of the Department of Medical Assistance Services, the contracted provider, its 36 37 subcontractors, and clients served; (ii) review the Department of Medical Assistance Services' oversight 38 of the Commonwealth's contract with the current nonemergency transportation provider; (iii) identify 39 remedies and alternatives available to the Commonwealth to resolve issues identified in the delivery of 40 Medicaid-supported nonemergency transportation services; and (iv) consider any other related matters as 41 the Office of the State Investigator General deems appropriate to meet the objectives of this study. 42 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Office of the State Investigator 43 General for this study, upon request. The Office of the State Investigator General shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2014, and 44 the State Investigator General shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an 45 executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2015 Regular 46 47 Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Office of the State Investigator General intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings **48** and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and 49 report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated 50 Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General 51 Assembly's website. 52

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
