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1	HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 71
2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3 4	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules
4 5	on February 28, 2014) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Carr)
6	Establishing a joint commission to commemorate the 100th anniversary of World War I and the 75th
7	anniversary of World War II in 2014 in Virginia.
8	WHEREAS, 2014 marks the 100th anniversary of World War I and the start of the 75th anniversary
9	of War II; and WHEEDEAS Would War I originally known as the Creat War provable significant and leating
10 11	WHEREAS, World War I, originally known as the Great War, wrought significant and lasting changes on the entire world between 1914 and 1918; with over 37 million casualties, it was one of the
12	deadliest conflicts in human history; and
13	WHEREAS, unresolved disputes and hostilities from World War I continued to simmer and after
14	Adolf Hitler's invasion of Poland in 1939, another great global conflict began, World War II, which
15	lasted from 1939 to 1945, involved more than 30 countries, and resulted in more than 50 million
16 17	military and civilian deaths, making the Second World War the bloodiest and largest war in history; and WHEREAS, many brave Virginia men and women served in the nation's Armed Services and paid
18	the ultimate sacrifice in the defense of freedom during World War I and World War II; and
19	WHEREAS, in 2014, the nation, many countries, and communities will commemorate the 100th
20	anniversary of World War I and the start of the 75th anniversary of World War II; and
21 22	WHEREAS, it is fitting that the Commonwealth establish a joint commission charged to make appropriate plans to honor and remember the patriotism and valor of its servicemen and servicewomen
$\frac{22}{23}$	who served and sacrificed for their country during World War I and World War II; now, therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint commission be
25	established to commemorate the 100th anniversary of World War I and the 75th anniversary of World
26	War II in 2014 in Virginia; and, be it
27 28	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the joint commission shall have a total membership of 15 members, that shall consist of eight legislative members and seven nonlegislative citizen members. Members shall
2 9	be appointed as follows: four members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the
30	House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the
31	Rules of the House of Delegates; four members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee
32 33	on Rules; and seven nonlegislative citizen members, of whom one shall be a World War I historian, one shall be a representative of the Virginia War Memorial, and one shall be a representative of the Virginia
33 34	Historical Society, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and one of whom shall be
35	a World War II historian, one shall be a representative of the Richmond City Council Carillon Advisory
36	Committee, and one shall be the Librarian of Virginia, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on
37 38	Rules. During its deliberations, the joint commission shall ensure that commemorative programs, events, and activities represent and reflect equally the patriotism, honor, and valor of all Virginians who served
39	in World War I and World War II. The joint commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from
40	among its membership, who shall be members of the General Assembly.
41	In its deliberations, the joint commission shall plan and implement appropriate commemorative
42 43	events and activities statewide that honor and memorialize the service and sacrifices of Virginia's men and women who served and sacrificed for their country during World War I and World War II.
4 3	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates.
45	Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint commission shall be
46	provided by the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the
47 48	Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department of Education. All agencies of the Commonwealth
40 49	shall provide assistance to the joint commission, upon request. The joint commission shall be limited to four meetings for the 2014 interim and four meetings for
50	the 2015 interim, and the direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$18,440 for each year without
51	approval as set out in this resolution. An estimated \$1,000 is allocated for speakers, materials, and other
52 52	resources. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization
53 54	of the chairman of the joint commission and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.
55	No recommendation of the joint commission shall be adopted if a majority of the House members or
56	a majority of the Senate members of the joint commission (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii)
57 59	vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the joint commission.
58 59	The joint commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2014, and for the second year by November 30, 2015, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative
	the second year by november 50, 2015, and the channian shan submit to the Division of Legislative

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60 Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first 61 day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall 62 state whether the joint commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report 63 of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive 64 summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative 65 Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the 66 General Assembly's website.

67 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
68 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
69 delay the period for the conduct of the commemoration, or authorize additional meetings during the

70 2014 and 2015 interims.

71 The joint commission shall expire on July 1, 2016.
