10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 63.2-317 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	<b>§ 63.2-317. Employment of counsel for local boards and employees; payment of expenses.</b> Except in those cases in which the attorney for the Commonwealth or county or city attorney
13 14	represents the local board, a local board may employ legal counsel in civil matters to give advice to or
15	represents the local board or any of its members or the employees of the local department and may pay
16	court costs and other expenses involved in the conduct of such civil matters from funds appropriated by
17	the local governing body for the administration of the local department. Such counsel may be employed
18	on a part-time basis for any particular action or actions. A local board may employ in-house counsel to
19	provide general legal advice and representation and advice related to specific actions. However, prior
20	approval of the Department shall be obtained by the local board before counsel is employed except in
21	instances where legal counsel is necessary for the provision of services or assistance to eligible
22	recipients under this title.
23	The Department may reimburse the local board for all or any part of such expenditures at the same
24	rate in effect for all other administrative costs at the time of the expenditure. However, the Department
25	shall not reimburse the local board for any expenses for which payment was available through an

insurance policy currently in force.
Where such counsel is employed by the local board, the attorney for the Commonwealth or city attorney or county attorney may be relieved of his responsibility to represent the local board or local department in that matter.
