3 A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-4507 of the Code of Virginia, relating to transportation districts; 4 appointments. 5

## Referred to Committee on Local Government

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 15.2-4507 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 11

§ 15.2-4507. Members of transportation district commissions.

A. Any transportation district commission created shall consist of the number of members the 12 13 component governments shall from time to time agree upon, or as may otherwise be provided by law. 14 The governing body of each participating county and city shall appoint from among its members the 15 number of commissioners to which the county or city is entitled; however, for those commissions with 16 powers as set forth in subsection A of § 15.2-4515, the governing body of each participating county or city is not limited to appointing commissioners from among its members. In addition, the governing 17 body may appoint from its number or otherwise, designated alternate members for those appointed to the 18 commission who shall be able to exercise all of the powers and duties of a commission member when 19 20 the regular member is absent from commission meetings. Each such appointee shall serve at the pleasure 21 of the appointing body; however, no appointee to a commission with powers as set forth in subsection B 22 of § 15.2-4515 may continue to serve when he is no longer a member of the appointing body. Each 23 governing body shall inform the commission of its appointments to and removals from the commission 24 by delivering to the commission a certified copy of the resolution making the appointment or causing 25 the removal.

In the case of a transportation district, commonly known as the Potomac and Rappahannock 26 27 Transportation Commission, which was established on or after July 1, 1986, and which includes more 28 than one jurisdiction located within the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, such commission shall also 29 include two members of the House of Delegates and one member of the Senate from legislative districts 30 located wholly or in part within the boundaries of the transportation district. The members of the House 31 of Delegates shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House for terms coincident with their terms of office, and the member of the Senate shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules for a term 32 coincident with his term of office. The members of the General Assembly shall be eligible for reappointment for successive terms. Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be 33 34 35 filled for the unexpired term. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments.

36 In the case of the Transportation District Commission of Hampton Roads, such commission shall 37 consist of one citizen member appointed by the Governor from each county and city embraced by the 38 Transportation District. However, for the gubernatorial appointments that will become effective July 1, 39 2016, three of the appointments shall be for initial terms of two years and three appointments shall be 40 for terms of four years. Thereafter, all gubernatorial appointments shall be for terms of four years so as to stagger the terms of the gubernatorial appointees. The governing body of each such county or city 41 may appoint either a member of its governing body or its county or city manager to serve as an ex 42 officio member with voting privileges. Every such ex officio member shall be allowed to attend all 43 44 meetings of the commission that other members may be required to attend. Vacancies shall be filled in 45 the same manner as the original appointments.

The Chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, or his designee, shall be a member of 46 47 each commission, ex officio with voting privileges. The chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation 48 Board may appoint an alternate member who may exercise all the powers and duties of the chairman of 49 the Commonwealth Transportation Board when neither the chairman of the Commonwealth 50 Transportation Board nor his designee is present at a commission meeting.

51 B. Any appointed member of a commission of a transportation district, commonly known as the 52 Northern Virginia Transportation Commission, which was established prior to July 1, 1986, and which 53 includes jurisdictions located within the Washington, D.C., metropolitan statistical area, and the Secretary of Transportation or his designee, is authorized to serve as a member of the board of directors 54 55 of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (Chapter 627 of the Acts of Assembly of 1958 as amended) and while so serving the provisions of § 2.2-2800 shall not apply to such member. In 56 appointing Virginia members of the board of directors of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit 57 58 Authority (WMATA), the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission shall include the Secretary of

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59 Transportation or his designee as a principal member on the board of directors of the WMATA. Any 60 designee serving as the principal member must reside in a locality served by WMATA.

61 In selecting from its membership those members to serve on the board of directors of the WMATA, 62 the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission shall comply with the following requirements:

63 1. A board member shall not have been an employee of WMATA within one year of appointment to 64 serve on the board of directors.

65 2. A board member shall have experience in at least one of the following: transit planning, 66 transportation planning, or land use planning; transit or transportation management or other public sector management; engineering; finance; public safety; homeland security; human resources; the law; or 67 knowledge of the region's transportation issues derived from working on regional transportation issue 68 69 resolution. 70

3. A member shall be a regular patron of the services provided by WMATA.

71 4. Members shall serve a term of four years with a maximum of two consecutive terms. Such term 72 or terms must coincide with their term on the body that appointed them to the Northern Virginia 73 Transportation Commission. Any vacancy created if a board member cannot fulfill his term because his 74 term on the appointing body had ended shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the member being replaced was appointed within 60 days of the vacancy. The initial appointments to a 75 76 four-year term will be as follows: the Secretary, or his designee, for a term of four years; the second 77 principal member for a term of three years; one alternate for a term of two years; and the remaining 78 alternate for a term of one year. Thereafter, members shall be appointed for terms of four years. Service 79 on the WMATA board of directors prior to July 1, 2012, shall not be considered in determining length 80 of service. Any person appointed to an initial one or two year term, or appointed to an unexpired term 81 in which two years or less is remaining, shall be eligible to serve two consecutive four-year terms after 82 serving the initial or unexpired term.

83 5. Members may be removed from the board of directors of the WMATA if they attend fewer than 84 three-fourths of the meetings in a calendar year; if they are conflicted due to employment at WMATA; 85 or if they are found to be in violation of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act 86 (§ 2.2-3100 et seq.). If a member is removed during a term, the vacancy shall be filled pursuant to the 87 provisions of subdivision 4.

6. Each member of the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission appointed to the board of 88 89 directors of the WMATA shall file semiannual reports with the Secretary of Transportation's office 90 beginning July 1, 2012. The reports shall include (i) the dates of attendance at WMATA board 91 meetings, (ii) any reasons for not attending a specific meeting, and (iii) dates and attendance at other 92 WMATA-related public events.

93 Any entity that provides compensation to a WMATA board member for his service on the WMATA 94 board shall be required to submit on July 1 of each year to the Secretary of Transportation the amount 95 of that compensation. Such letter will remain on file with the Secretary's office and be available for 96 public review.

97 C. (Effective July 1, 2014) In the case of two or more transportation commissions which each 98 include at least one jurisdiction located within the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area and which have 99 entered into an agreement to operate a commuter railway, the agreement governing the creation of the 100 railway shall provide that the Chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board or his designee 101 shall have one vote on the oversight board for the railway. For each year in which the state contribution 102 to the railway is greater than or equal to the highest contribution from an individual jurisdiction, the 103 total annual jurisdictional subsidy used to determine vote weights shall be recalculated to include the Commonwealth contributing an amount equal to the highest contributing jurisdiction. The vote weights 104 105 shall be recalculated to provide the Chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board or his designee the same weight as the highest contributing jurisdiction. The revised vote weights shall be used 106 107 in determining the passage of motions before the oversight board.
