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12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That § 54.1-2722 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of
14	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-326.4 as follows:
15	§ 32.1-326.4. Teledentistry pilot program.
16	A. For the purposes of this section and § 54.1-2722:
17	"Teledentistry " means the delivery of dental services through the use of interactive audio, video, or
18	other electronic media used for the purpose of diagnosis, consultation, or treatment. Teledentistry does
19	not include audio-only telephone, email, or facsimile transmission.
20	B. The Department of Medical Assistance Services shall establish a pilot program providing dental
21	services to school-age children who are eligible to receive pediatric dental services through the Smiles
22	for Children program. The pilot program shall be further limited to children in school divisions in
23	which at least 50 percent of the elementary school students have not been examined by a dentist within
24	the preceding 12 months or have no dental home of record. Dentists participating in the program shall
25	provide supervision to licensed dental hygienists through teledentistry. The dental hygienists shall
26	provide the same services and work under the same protocol as dental hygienists employed by the State
27	Department of Health pursuant to subsection E of § 54.1-2722.
28	C. The Department shall amend the State Plan for Medical Assistance and the Family Access to Medical Insurance Security (FAMIS) Plan to provide security for the costs of semicon provided in
29 30	Medical Insurance Security (FAMIS) Plan to provide coverage for the costs of services provided in
30 31	accordance with this section and may promulgate any rule or regulation or make any coding, reimbursement, or plan modification it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
32	D. The Department shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Virginia Dental
32 33	Association and any other entity the Department deems appropriate establishing protocols for the
33 34	administration of the program.
35	§ 54.1-2722. License; application; qualifications; practice of dental hygiene.
36	A. No person shall practice dental hygiene unless he possesses a current, active, and valid license
37	from the Board of Dentistry. The licensee shall have the right to practice dental hygiene in the
38	Commonwealth for the period of his license as set by the Board, under the direction of any licensed
39	dentist.
40	B. An application for such license shall be made to the Board in writing and shall be accompanied
41	by satisfactory proof that the applicant (i) is of good moral character, (ii) is a graduate of a dental
42	hygiene program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation and offered by an accredited
43	institution of higher education, (iii) has passed the dental hygiene examination given by the Joint
44	Commission on Dental Examinations, and (iv) has successfully completed a clinical examination
45	acceptable to the Board.
46	C. The Board may grant a license to practice dental hygiene to an applicant licensed to practice in
47	another jurisdiction if he (i) meets the requirements of subsection B; (ii) holds a current, unrestricted
48	license to practice dental hygiene in another jurisdiction in the United States; (iii) has not committed any
49	act that would constitute grounds for denial as set forth in § 54.1-2706; and (iv) meets other
50	qualifications as determined in regulations promulgated by the Board.
51	D. A licensed dental hygienist may, under the direction or general supervision of a licensed dentist
52	and subject to the regulations of the Board, perform services that are educational, diagnostic, therapeutic,
53	or preventive. These services shall not include the establishment of a final diagnosis or treatment plan for a dontal particular to subsection V_{i} of S_{i} 54.1.2408 a diagnosis or treatment plan
54	for a dental patient. Pursuant to subsection V of § 54.1-3408, a licensed dental hygienist may
55 54	administer topical oral fluorides under an oral or written order or a standing protocol issued by a dentist
56 57	or a doctor of medicine or osteopathic medicine.
57 58	A dentist may also authorize a dental hygienist under his direction to administer Schedule VI nitrous
50	oxide and oxygen inhalation analgesia and, to persons 18 years of age or older, Schedule VI local

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anesthesia. In its regulations, the Board of Dentistry shall establish the education and trainingrequirements for dental hygienists to administer such controlled substances under a dentist's direction.

61 For the purposes of this section, "general supervision" means that a dentist has evaluated the patient
62 and prescribed authorized services to be provided by a dental hygienist; however, the dentist need not be
63 present in the facility while the authorized services are being provided.

For the purposes of this section, "remote supervision" means that a public health dentist has regular, periodic communications with a public health dental hygienist regarding patient treatment, but such dentist may not have done an initial examination of the patients who are to be seen and treated by the dental hygienist and may not be present with the dental hygienist when dental hygiene services are being provided.

69 The Board shall provide for an inactive license for those dental hygienists who hold a current, 70 unrestricted license to practice in the Commonwealth at the time of application for an inactive license 71 and who do not wish to practice in Virginia. The Board shall promulgate such regulations as may be 72 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section, including requirements for remedial education to 73 activate a license.

74 E. Notwithstanding any provision of law, a dental hygienist employed by the Virginia Department of 75 Health who holds a license issued by the Board of Dentistry may provide educational and preventative 76 dental care in the Commonwealth under the remote supervision of a dentist employed by the Department 77 of Health. A dental hygienist providing such services shall practice pursuant to a protocol adopted by 78 the Commissioner of Health on September 23, 2010, having been developed jointly by (i) the medical 79 directors of the Cumberland Plateau, Southside, and Lenowisco Health Districts; (ii) dental hygienists employed by the Department of Health; (iii) the Director of the Dental Health Division of the 80 Department of Health; (iv) one representative of the Virginia Dental Association; and (v) one representative of the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association. Such protocol shall be adopted by the 81 82 83 Board as regulations.

F. A report of services provided by dental hygienists pursuant to such protocol, including their impact upon the oral health of the citizens of the Commonwealth, shall be prepared and submitted by the Department of Health to the Virginia Secretary of Health and Human Resources annually. Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize or establish the independent practice of dental hygiene.

6. Notwithstanding any provision of law, a licensed dental hygienist may provide educational and
preventative dental care in the Commonwealth under the supervision through teledentistry of a dentist
pursuant to § 32.1-326.4. A dental hygienist providing such services shall practice pursuant to the
protocol adopted by the Board in accordance with subsection E.

92 2. That the provisions of the first enactment of this act shall expire July 1, 2016.

93 3. That the Department of Medical Assistance Services shall report, by November 1, 2016, to the

94 Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and 95 Senate Finance Committees on the benefits, if any, of using teledentistry for the provision of

96 services required by this act.
