13 WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson proudly served his country in the United States Army and received a law degree from Harvard Law School before embarking on a distinguished legal career with Sullivan & 14 15 Cromwell in New York; and

WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson helped open the firm's Paris office before returning to the United States 16 17 and working on Nelson Rockefeller's presidential campaign; and

WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson settled in Reston when he became the first director of the New 18 19 Communities Program with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

20 WHEREAS, in 1972, Bill Nicoson opened his own legal practice, becoming a respected consultant in international finance, community development, and urban governance who shared his expertise at 21 22 professional conferences, in written articles, and in the classroom; and

23 WHEREAS, one of the founders of the Connection newspapers in Northern Virginia, Bill Nicoson 24 served as publisher for many years and penned numerous columns; and

25 WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson took an active role in community affairs, generously giving of his time and talents to help organize and serve on the boards and committees of numerous organizations that enhance 26 27 the well-being of Reston's citizens; and

28 WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson served on the board of the Reston Association; the Greater Reston Arts 29 Center; Celebrating Special Children; the Reston Historic Trust, which he also served as president for 10 30 years; and Planned Community Archives, housed at George Mason University; and

31 WHEREAS, a vital part of the development of the Reston community, Bill Nicoson was honored for his many contributions with a 2002 Best of Reston Award; and 32

33 WHEREAS, a man of many interests, Bill Nicoson loved to read, cook, play chess, and entertain 34 friends and family with his piano playing; he was also a member of the Cosmos Club and St. Anne's 35 Episcopal Church; and

36 WHEREAS, Bill Nicoson will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife, Patricia; 37 stepchildren, William and Mary, and their families; numerous other family members and friends; and 38 Reston residents who continue to reap the benefits of his years of service to their community; now, 39 therefore, be it

40 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 41 note with great sadness the loss of an admired citizen of Reston, William Jarvie Nicoson; and, be it
