4. Title: Regional Criminal Justice Academy Training Fund; local fee.

5. Summary: Changes the date by which a locality must have been operating a certified independent criminal justice academy from July 1, 2010, to July 1, 2012, to allow certain localities to receive money from the Fund for operating their criminal justice academies.

Fiscal Implications: Under the proposed legislation, localities that operate a certified independent criminal justice academy that began operations between July 1, 2010 and July 1, 2012 would be permitted to charge and collect a local fee to help fund their criminal justice academy. According to the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS), the proposed legislation is not expected to create a material fiscal impact.
