- **4. Title:** Apprentice hunters.
- **5. Summary:** This bill allows persons holding an apprentice hunting license to hunt unsupervised if they have successfully completed a hunter education course. Currently, apprentice hunters who opt to complete hunter education must purchase a regular hunting license in order to hunt independently, even if their apprentice license remains valid for a period of time.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** It is anticipated that this bill will result in a nongeneral revenue loss to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries; however, the department has sufficient cash reserves to absorb this reduction. The estimated annual loss is approximately \$55,000.
