3. Committee: Senate Committee on Courts of Justice

4. Title: Recordings and records; 911 emergency service calls; admissibility.

5. Summary: Provides that in any civil proceeding, recordings and records of any 911 emergency service calls shall be admissible in evidence provided such recordings and records, or copies, are authenticated by the custodian thereof or by the person to whom the custodian reports. The bill also provides that authenticated includes the date and time of the incoming call and the incoming phone number associated with the call.
