- **4.** Title: Sex offenders; reregistration; name change.
- **5. Summary:** The proposed legislation provides that a person required to register with the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry must re-register in person with the local law-enforcement agency within three days following a change of the person's name and that a person who is incarcerated or civilly committed must notify the Registry within three days following a name change. Currently, there is no time specified for when such person has to reregister. The bill also requires that the information contained in the Registry must include any former name of a person required to register if he has lawfully changed his name during the period for which he is required to register.
