**3. Committee:** Commerce and Labor

**4. Title:** Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission; vacancies.

**5. Summary:** Authorizes the chairman of the Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission to recall retired members of the Commission to participate in a review of an award when vacancies exist on the Commission. The measure also provides for the compensation of recalled retired members and clarifies that more than one deputy commissioner may be appointed to participate in a review.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Fiscal impact estimates are not available.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission, this bill is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on the Commission. The expected frequency of a vacancy on the Commission necessitating retired members of the Commission to be recalled or the appointment of more than one deputy commissioner to hear a review is minimal and occurs so infrequently that no information is currently available that can be used to estimate the fiscal impact.

If a vacancy arises, the appointment of additional deputy commissioners or retired commissioners may result in additional travel expenses and retired commissioners would be compensated \$200 per day. Since vacancies are not expected to occur with any frequency, the Commission expects to be able to absorb any such expenses.
