## 5. Summary:

Under current law, manufacture, selling, or distributing 28 grams or more of methamphetamines is punishable with a sentence of 5 to 40 years in prison, three years of which shall be a mandatory minimum sentence. If the quantity of methamphetamines were 227 grams or more, the sentence would 10 years to life in prison, with a five-year mandatory minimum sentence.

The proposed legislation would increase the penalties, as follows:

28 grams or more—10 years to 40 years; 10-year mandatory minimum 227 grams or more—10 years to life; 10-year mandatory minimum

# 8. Fiscal Implications:

By increasing the mandatory minimum sentences for the manufacture, selling, or distributing methamphetamines, the proposed legislation will result in the need for additional prison beds.

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$2,660,812 (the highest annual cost over the next six years). The amount is based on the projection that the legislation will result in 89 additional inmates being incarcerated in prison.
