- 3. Committee: Militia, Police and Public Safety
- **4. Title:** Virginia Disaster Relief Fund established.
- **5. Summary:** Creates the Virginia Disaster Relief Fund, to be administered by the Virginia Department of Emergency Management. The bill provides that moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purpose of helping Virginia households recover from a natural or manmade disaster and that the Fund shall aid voluntary nonprofit and faith-based organizations, local recovery groups, and local governments to satisfy a disaster household's unmet needs.

- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary; See Item 8 below.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: The Virginia Disaster Relief Fund was established in April 2011 to assist communities across Virginia impacted by natural disasters in 2011. At the time it was established, the Fund was supported by a one-time infusion of uncommitted general fund balances equaling (\$600,000) and by private donations from citizens and businesses. The proposed legislation provides that all moneys as may be appropriated by the General Assembly and any gifts, bequests, grants, or donations shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. According to the Virginia Department of Emergency Management, the proposed legislation will not have a fiscal impact on the department. Unless general fund support is provided by the General Assembly, there is no impact expected on state funds.
