## 5. Summary:

Under current law, a person, who otherwise legally may possess a handgun, does not have to have a concealed handgun permit to carry a handgun in a personal, private motor vehicle or vessel if the handgun is secured in a container or compartment in the vehicle or vessel. The proposed legislation would define "compartment" as any area in the vehicle or vessel that possesses the ability to be closed. Furthermore, the legislation would define "secured" as meaning that the container or compartment "be closed but not necessarily locked".
