3. Committee: Courts of Justice.

4. Title: Fare enforcement inspectors.

5. Summary: Provides for the appointment of fare enforcement inspectors to enforce payment of fares for use of mass transit facilities. The bill also provides that failure of a transit user to produce proof of fare payment constitutes a Class 4 misdemeanor.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation may result in increased operating costs for the affected transit system; but, may increase revenues by minimizing the number of users not paying fares. Violations of this legislation will result in the issuance of a summons and is punishable as a Class 4 misdemeanor (up to \$250 fine). Any revenue derived from this legislation will be deposited in the Literary Fund.
