**4. Title:** Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC); mixed beverage licenses

**5. Summary:** Provides that mixed beverage licenses may be granted to establishments located (i) on property adjacent to the intersection of U.S. Route 220 North and State Route 57, operated as a country club as of December 31, 1926, in Henry County, (ii) on property adjacent to Lake Lanier, operated as a country club as of December 31, 1932, in Henry County, (iii) on property fronting on Old Jonesboro Road between Routes 823 and 808, located approximately 4,500 feet south of Interstate 81, and operated as a country club.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation would permit ABC to issue mixed beverage licenses to three country clubs in Henry County which would permit the clubs to serve liquor by the drink on the country club premises.

According to ABC, this legislation is not expected to have a material fiscal impact. There will likely be a nominal increase in revenue as a result of issuance of the three new mixed beverage licenses. The exact amount of revenue increase will depend on the number of people that can be seated in each establishment. The mixed beverage license fee could range from \$975 to \$1,330 per license.
