2. Patron: Howell, Janet D.

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Suspected abuse or neglect of a child; reports to law enforcement

5. Summary: The enrolled bill requires local department of social services (LDSS) to notify the local attorney for the Commonwealth and local law enforcement agency of specified complaints of suspected child abuse or neglect immediately, but in no case more than two hours of the receipt of the complaint. In addition, the LDSS must provide a copy of all its records and information related to the investigation of the complaint. The bill also requires the LDSS to complete a written report on a form, provided by the Board of Social Services, for each case in which a local law-enforcement agency is notified of a case of suspected child abuse or neglect.

7. Minimal Fiscal Impact: Final (See Item 8)

8. Fiscal Implications: The Office of Family Services in the Department of Social Services reports that the only new requirement this proposal would impose on local social services staff is the bill's provisions associated with completing the required form and obtaining the necessary signatures. The Office asserts that completing the mandated form can be done in a matter of minutes; while the time associated with obtaining the signatures will vary (via fax, face-to-face, etc.) by situation. Based on this assessment, it is assumed that the proposed legislation will not have a fiscal impact.
