4. Title: Sex Offender and Crimes against Minors Registry Act; solicitation of prostitution; minors.

- **5. Summary:** The substitute legislation expands §18.2-355 by making it a Class 4 felony for any person who takes a minor into, or persuades, encourages, or causes a minor to enter, a bawdy place, or takes or causes such person to be taken to any place for purposes of prostitution. It expands the offenses requiring registration under the Sex Offender and Crimes against Minors Registry to include paragraph 4 of §18.2-355 and the crime of soliciting a minor for prostitution under § 18.2-246 (B).
