**2. Patron:** Stuart

**3. Committee:** Passed Both Houses

**4. Title:** Living shorelines general permit.

**5. Summary:** Requires regulations for the issuance of general permits for living shoreline projects to include an expedited review process. The bill allows construction of such projects under the local wetlands and coastal primary sand dunes ordinances. A living shoreline is a shoreline management practice that provides erosion control and water quality benefits; protects, restores, or enhances natural shoreline habitat; and maintains coastal processes through the strategic placement of plants, stone, and fill.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Final. See Item 8, below.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill adds the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to the permitting process. DEQ does not anticipate that this bill will result in a significant impact other than additional time from staff. This bill may reduce local revenue but that is indeterminate.
