4. Title: Withdrawal from secondary highway system.

5. Summary: Allows lane-mile payments of \$12,529 for a county with a charter that borders four cities, which elects to withdraw from the secondary system after June 30, 2014. The bill also allows the Commissioner of Highways to enter into agreements with such counties that withdraw for traffic control.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Transportation (VDOT), this bill would only apply to Chesterfield County. Additional revenue would be needed to fund additional Departmental costs associated with higher rate of payments to Chesterfield. Otherwise, these funds would likely come from the state's Secondary Maintenance budget, which would reduce funds available to VDOT-maintained county secondary roads.
