11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 2 of Chapter 35 of Title 58.1 a section numbered 58.1-3508.6 as follows:
13 14	§ 58.1-3508.6. Separate classification of machinery and tools used in producing or generating
15	renewable energy.
16	Machinery and tools, including repair and replacement parts, owned by a business and used directly
17	in producing or generating renewable energy shall constitute a classification for local taxation separate
18	from other classifications of machinery and tools as defined in § 58.1-3507. The governing body of any
19	county, city, or town may levy a tax on such classification of property at a different rate from the tax
20	levied on other machinery and tools. The rate of tax and the rate of assessment shall not exceed that
21	applicable to the general class of machinery and tools.
22	The rate of tax and rate of assessment under this section shall not apply to machinery and tools
23 24	owned by a business and used directly in producing or generating renewable energy covered under Chapter 26 ( $\$$ 58 1 2600 at seq.) unless the rate of tax and rate of assessment under this section would

23 26	As used in this section, "renewable energy" means energy derived from sunlight, wind, falling water,
