10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 10.1-204.1 as follows: § 10.1-204.1. State Trails Advisory Committee established; report.
12	A. The State Trails Advisory Committee (the Committee) is hereby established as an advisory
13 14	committee of the Department of Conservation and Recreation to assist the Commonwealth in developing
15	and implementing a statewide system of attractive, sustainable, connected, and enduring trails for the
16	perpetual use and enjoyment of the citizens of the Commonwealth and future generations. The
17	Committee shall be appointed by the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation and
18	shall be composed of a representative from the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, the Virginia
19	Department of Transportation, the Virginia Outdoors Foundation, the U.S. Forest Service, and the U.S.
20	National Park Service; the Virginia Director of the Chesapeake Bay Commission; and nonlegislative
21	citizen members, including representatives from the Virginia Outdoors Plan Technical Advisory
22	Committee and the Recreational Trails Advisory Committee and other individuals with technical
23	expertise in trail creation, construction, maintenance, use, and management. The Committee shall meet
24	at least twice each calendar year.
25	B. The Advisory Committee shall examine and provide recommendations regarding (i) options to
26	close the gaps in a statewide system of trails as described in § 10.1-204; (ii) creative public and private
27 28	funding strategies and partnerships to leverage resources to fund the development of trails; (iii)
20 29	integrated approaches to promote and market trail values and benefits; (iv) the development of specialty trails, including concepts related to old-growth forest trails across the Commonwealth; (v) strategies to
3 0	encourage and create linkages between communities and open space; (vi) strategies to foster
31	communication and networking among trail stakeholders; (vii) strategies to increase tourism and
32	commercial activities associated with a statewide trail system, (viii) strategies to enhance the
33	involvement of organizations that promote outdoor youth activities, including the Boy Scouts of the
34	U.S.A. and Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. and the 4-H program of the Virginia Cooperative Extension; and
35	(ix) other practices, standards, statutes, and guidelines that the Director of the Department of
36	Conservation and Recreation determines may enhance the effectiveness of trail planning across the
37	Commonwealth.
38	C. No later than October 1 of each year, the Director shall provide a status report on the work of
39	the Committee to the Chairman of the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural
40	Resources; the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources;
41 42	and the Chairman and members of the Virginia delegation to the Chesapeake Bay Commission. The
42 43	report shall include (i) current and future plans for a statewide system of attractive, sustainable, and connected and anduring trails across the Commonwealth and (ii) any recommendations from the
43 44	connected and enduring trails across the Commonwealth and (ii) any recommendations from the Committee that will be incorporated into the Virginia Outdoors Plan, which plan shall serve as the
45	repository for recommendations from the Committee. The Virginia Outdoors Plan updates shall be used
46	to capture and advance the concepts developed by the Committee.
47	D. Members of the Committee shall receive no compensation for their service and shall not be
48	entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
49	E. For the purposes of this section, "old-growth forest" means a forest ecosystem distinguished by
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trees older than 150 years and tree-related structures that naturally contribute to biodiversity of the
forested ecosystems and provide habitat to native Virginia wildlife species, including wildlife species that
have been approved for introduction by the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.
