That §§ 54.1-3435 and 54.1-3435.01 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 12 13 follows: 14 § 54.1-3435. License to act as wholesale distributor; renewal; fee. A. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the wholesale distribution of prescription drugs in 15 16 this the Commonwealth without a valid unrevoked license issued by the Board. The applicant for licensure as a wholesale distributor, as defined in § 54.1-3401, in this the Commonwealth shall apply to 17 the Board for a license, using such forms as the Board may furnish; renew such license using such 18 forms as the Board may furnish, if granted, annually on a date determined by the Board in regulation; 19 20 notify the Board within thirty 30 days of any substantive change in the information reported on the application form previously submitted to the Board; and remit a fee as determined by the Board. 21 22 B. A wholesale distributor that ceases distribution of controlled substances to a licensed or permitted 23 dispenser located in the Commonwealth due to suspicious ordering of controlled substances by the 24 dispenser shall notify the Board of Pharmacy of the cessation of distribution to the dispenser within five 25 days of notifying the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration of the suspicious order pursuant to 21 C.F.R. § 1301.74. For the purpose of this subsection, "suspicious ordering" means placing of orders of 26 27 unusual size, orders that deviate substantially from a normal pattern, and orders of unusual frequency. A wholesale distributor that, in good faith and without malicious intent, reports cessation of distribution 28 29 due to suspicious ordering in accordance with this subsection shall be immune from civil liability 30 resulting therefrom. 31 C. The Board may promulgate such regulations relating to the storage, handling, and distribution of 32 prescription drugs by wholesale distributors as it deems necessary to implement this section, to prevent 33 diversion of prescription drugs, and to protect the public. 34 § 54.1-3435.01. Registration of nonresident wholesale distributors; renewal; fee. 35 A. Any person located outside this the Commonwealth who engages in the wholesale distribution of 36 prescription drugs into this the Commonwealth shall be registered with the Board. The applicant for 37 registration as a nonresident wholesale distributor shall apply to the Board using such forms as the Board may furnish; renew such registration, if granted, using such forms as the Board may furnish, 38 39 annually on a date determined by the Board in regulation; notify the Board within thirty 30 days of any 40 substantive change in the information previously submitted to the Board; and remit a fee, which shall be 41 the fee specified for wholesale distributors located within the Commonwealth. 42 B. The nonresident wholesale distributor shall at all times maintain a valid, unexpired license, permit, or registration in the state in which it is located and shall furnish proof of such upon application and at 43 44 each renewal. 45 C. Records of prescription drugs distributed into this the Commonwealth shall be maintained in such a manner that they are readily retrievable from records of distributions into other jurisdictions and shall 46 be provided to the Board, its authorized agent, or any agent designated by the Superintendent of the 47 Department of State Police upon request within seven days of receipt of such request. 48 49 D. A nonresident wholesale distributor that ceases distribution of controlled substances to a licensed 50 or permitted dispenser located in the Commonwealth due to suspicious ordering of controlled substances 51 by the dispenser shall notify the Board of Pharmacy of the cessation of distribution to the dispenser 52 within five days of notifying the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration of the suspicious order pursuant 53 to 21 C.F.R. § 1301.74. For the purpose of this subsection, "suspicious ordering" means placing of orders of unusual size, orders that deviate substantially from a normal pattern, and orders of unusual 54 55 frequency. A nonresident wholesale distributor that, in good faith and without malicious intent, reports cessation of distribution due to suspicious ordering in accordance with this subsection shall be immune 56 57 from civil liability resulting therefrom. 58 E. This section shall not apply to persons who distribute prescription drugs directly to a licensed
